Downtown Elmira Business Improvement Area (BIA) Community Improvement Plan (CIP) Update to Council

Dana Costello of the Downtown Business Improvement Area (BIA) Board made a presentation to Council regarding the BIA's Community Improvement Plan (CIP), which highlighted:

- A summary of the projects that the BIA has completed including wall, mural and sidewalk art, bench renewal, and downtown beautification efforts
- Halton Hills Community Improvement Plan promotional video
- Active Downtown Elmira CIP programs currently ongoing, including its grants program
- Remainder of CIP programs not yet implemented and main areas of focus
- Proposed uses of tax fund levy monies and request that the implementation of the CIP be undertaken by the Township

Council discussed the incentive programs including the façade program, inquired about the Township acquiring responsibility for something that is only Elmira-specific versus a municipality-wide plan, the question of staff capacity to implement a CIP, and current barriers to the BIA implementing the CIP.

Delegations

Proposed Legislation to Reverse Previous Decisions on Municipal Official Plans/Official Plan Amendments

Mayor Shantz discussed the letter of response to the Province, emphasizing the goal of maintaining Township control over staged, planned growth. Council discussed potential conflicts, the benefits of growth that is development-specific, the potential cost associated with Ontario Land Tribunal proceedings, and the implications of Bill 23 (More Homes Built Faster Act, 2022). Council discussed the challenges of the process imposed by the Province.

Delegate: Tom McLaughlin, Thomasfield Homes

Mr. McLaughlin expressed their support for the Mayor's response and thanked Council for their time. Council discussed Thomasfield's development rate for approved lots, affordability of their current and planned developments, and environmental/green efforts.

Delegate: Sheena Campbell, peopleCare Communities

Ms. Campbell gave a brief overview of peopleCare Communities and their efforts to establish long-term care facilities in Woolwich, offering their support of the Mayor's response as the recommended area for growth would allow for a future long-term care home and provide the long-term care that the community is in need of.

Delegate: Mike Puopolo, Polocorp Inc.

Mr. Puopolo expressed their support for the Mayor's response, emphasizing the need for sustained, planned growth, requesting that consideration be given to servicing costs at early stages of development, and discussed Polocorp's proposed areas for development

Delegate: Vaughn Bender, Schlegel Urban Developments

Mr. Bender discussed their active participation in the original Regional Official Plan review process and asked Council to consider the housing and affordability challenges facing the local economy, to focus on shaping the local community through collaborative opportunities, and holistic transportation needs. Mr. Bender provided an overview of their strategy for developing multi-unit types of housing across the Region.

Delegate: Mike Gilles, 1604962 Ontario

Mr. Gilles expressed their support for the Mayor's response, emphasizing the importance of collaboration and continuation of developing housing for demographics such as seniors.

Written Submissions

Written submissions were received by the Municipal Clerks Office from Stuart Martin, Delmer Martin, and Polocorp, (on behalf of Green Horizons Sod) in support of the Mayor's response to the Province.

Unregistered Delegate: John Messina

Mr. Messina expressed concern regarding his ongoing request to develop a small parcel of land in the Township just outside the Kitchener boundary in the Bridgeport area to provide affordable housing on fully serviced lands and requested that Council revisit the proposal for 165 Bloomingdale Road. Staff explained that smaller settlements in rural areas were not part of the last official plan reviews, but that a rural official plan review could potentially begin next year.

Council discussed:

- Planning and settlement boundaries Council's stated preference is for Woolwich to control and stage growth according to the needs of the community.
- Provincial process being flawed and not transparent, placing Council in a difficult position.

- Housing crisis affecting the Region and the Township, especially in terms of affordable housing shortages.
- Council members offered differing opinions on ROPA 6 versus the Province's amendments, noting the need for housing, control over growth, and environmental concerns.

Moved by Mayor Shantz Seconded by Councillor Schwindt That Council supports the Mayor's letter of response to the Province, as presented.

A recorded vote was requested by Mayor Shantz.

Letter from Extend-A-Family Requesting Council's Endorsement of Ontario Disability Support Program (ODSP) Rate Increase Motion

- 2. Call on the Provincial Government to support Feed Canada's recommendation to stop the clawbacks meaning OW and ODSP will allow recipients their first \$1000 earned without penalty and to exempt benefits such as CPP, WSIB, EI and the upcoming CDB from clawbacks as well; and
- 3. That a copy of this resolution be sent to the Premier of Ontario, local and area MPs and MPPs and the Association of Municipalities of Ontario for further consideration.
